- 11) Trail Mix Report Spanish Valley drive trail is still slowly moving forward. Crystal wants to know if she can have a gate out her property to the trail. They are just looking at properties who will be affected by the trail. Sheri Griffith has been our main person on that.
- 12) Ken's lake corrals were discussed. We wanted to take them down and move them to a better place but they won't let us. It can be only \$20 a night as long as you take just the one site.
- 13) Our next corral project is hopefully up at Medicine lake. But not associated with a camp site. Forestry will be easier because they will have money to pay for the corral so we don't have to fund it. The suggestion is to make a large corral and relinquish maintenance of corrals to them.
- 14) South Mountain's new trail was discussed. More biker friendly.
