Lee's Pass Trail to the Kolob Arch



Description: At an estimated 310 ft. long, the **Kolob Arch** is one of the freestanding largest arches in the world. From the Lee's Pass Trailhead, it's about 6 miles in to the Kolob Arch trail. There is a tie rail (which was just replaced—a joint venture between the Park Service and BCHU-SW) at the junction of the two trails. It's a 4/10 mile walk to the arch—and well worth it. Water for the horses is available long the trail in LaVerkin creek. This is one of the most beautiful rides in So. Utah. It's a late spring to late fall ride—not open in winter. Elevation at the trailhead is close to 6000ft. The parking is very limited—pull outs along the road past the trail head. Suggest saddling down at the visitor's center.

Directions: Take Exit 40 off of I-15 and go to the Visitors Center to register. **THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE ONLY ALLOWS 12 HEARTBEATS IN A GROUP—THAT'S 6 HORSE & RIDERS.** The drive up the Kolob Canyons Road is in itself, quite a spectacular ride. The trail head is on the left just as you top the hill. Drive past it and note the turn outs along the left side of the road. You can make a U turn and go back and park in a turn out, or there is a turn around area in the parking lot at the end of the road. Please preserve our right to ride—Leave No Trace. Clean up around your trailer before you leave. Thanks!
